01 Introduction

The AMWAJ Alliance is a community of like-minded media professionals and organisations with the common goal of promoting communication on water issues in the Mediterranean. In 2024, AMWAJ focused on building a stronger and more connected community and supporting young journalists in the Mediterranean. In addition to strengthening its regular activities such as events (Tabadul), content development (Tayyarat) and the alliance's existing network, the AMWAJ team launched a WhatsApp community to improve fluid communication and the sharing of knowledge and resources among members. The community has been a great success, gaining a high level of membership in a short period of time, with regular and insightful exchanges. The WhatsApp community was highlighted by members as a great resource, not previously available in the Mediterranean region, to connect professionals, researchers and journalists/communicators working on sustainability issues.

In terms of supporting young journalists, the AMWAJ Alliance launched the first call for the AMWAJ Fellowship Programme for Journalists in 2024. The call was aimed at young journalists with less than 5 years of experience in Eastern and Southern Mediterranean countries. With great success in the number and quality of the applications (a full report can be found here, the selection committee finally selected the Moroccan journalist Basma El Atti as the first AMWAJ Media Fellow, who will receive financial and mentoring support from January to April 2025.

Tayyarat - ÜJÜÜ ("currents" or "streams" in Arabic) stands for AMWAJ's stories. It collects opinions, stories and insights around water, energy and sustainability around the Mediterranean. In 2024, Tayyarat focused on environmental justice. We highlighted the unequal impact of climate change on different groups in Mediterranean societies and presented narratives and initiatives that resist, innovate and adapt in the face of environmental injustice Highlights:





1. War and Environment in Syria: How Conflict Shapes Forests

21 JUNE 2024

This interview with Angham Daiyoub (CREAF) highlights the often underestimated and understudied environmental impacts of armed conflict in Syria, which extend into social and economic spheres and can influence peacebuilding and reconstruction efforts. Angham Daiyoub, a pre-doctoral researcher at CREAF, one of AMWAJ's members, focuses on environmental justice, particularly in Syria. In her study, published in July 2023 in the peer-reviewed journal Land, Angham and her colleagues explored the correlation between armed conflict and deforestation in Syria. Using satellite imagery, the study revealed that Syria lost approximately 20% of its forests between 2010 and 2019 due to the civil war. In her interview with Mariam Younes from AMWAJ, Angham discusses the causes of forest depletion and its broad impacts on Syria's environment, society and economy.

2. Heat-Stricken Bus Terminal: Ilidža's Urban Heat Island and Health Impact

18 DECEMBER 2024

This article looks at how the urban heat island effect affects Ilidža, Bosnia and Herzegovina. The lack of greenery and shade at the local bus station shows how extreme heat affects health, infrastructure and ecosystems. This phenomenon increases health risks, reduces productivity, damages critical infrastructure in transport, energy and health, and exacerbates environmental challenges such as water scarcity and crop failure, leading to food insecurity. Research from a CENER 21 study shows urban populations are more sensitive to temperature changes than rural populations, with variations from month to month. Disease incidence decreases in urban areas during autumn transitions, but increases more in warmer months than in rural areas.

3. WE&B Promotes Innovative Solutions and Stakeholder Action in Tunisia

28 NOVEMBER 2024

In this article, Nicolás Marín discusses Tunisia's worsening water scarcity, exacerbated by climate change. With annual water consumption below 430 m³ per capita and a high water stress index, demand and coastal aquifer salinisation could push the country to a critical point. Tunisia has implemented several initiatives, including its 2015 Nationally Determined Contribution (NDC). A key example is the Valeur-Gabès programme, in which AMWAJ members WE&B and MedCities played a central role. In collaboration with the Barcelona Metropolitan Area (AMB) and the Municipality of Gabès, and funded by the EU Delegation to Tunisia, WE&B led a study on non-conventional water resources and developed a municipal water management plan for Gabès between 2021 and 2022.

4. White Phosphorus – The Overlooked War Against Infrastructure and Environment in South Lebanon

27 FEBRUARY 2024

Mariam Younes examines the 50% surge in Lebanese olive oil prices in 2023, hitting USD 150 per jerrycan. This was due to Lebanon's economic crisis, poor harvests and production cycle. The conflict between Israel and Hezbollah also played a role. Since 8 October, air strikes on Lebanese villages near the Israeli border have prevented residents from harvesting olives and destroyed trees, particularly with white phosphorus attacks. Many trees, some decades old, have been burned. Experts are concerned about the long-term effects of white phosphorus on soil and water. A full assessment will be possible once the conflict is over.





Mediterráneo Vivo: Exploring the Future of Our Ecosystems

22 MARCH 2024

For World Water Day, AMWAJ hosted the Tabadul event Mediterráneo Vivo: Exploring the Future of Our Ecosystems at the Centro Cultural Jacaranda in Godella, Valencia, Spain. The event was led by Patricia Carbonell, in collaboration with REVOLVE, Amigues de la Terra València and Cuidem Godella. It explored how to promote community action for its restoration and conservation. How can we protect our Mediterranean environment in the face of climate change, desertification and biodiversity loss? The event brought together experts and enthusiasts to explore practices for restoration and conservation, while showcasing ongoing initiatives to address these challenges. The roundtable discussion featured panelists. Amanda Subiela, an environmental expert from Amigues de la Terra Valencia, shared examples of successful awareness-raising campaigns in the region. Diego S. Intrigliolo Molina, a senior scientist, provided key data on desertification in the region and highlighted actions to combat it. Juan Solves, a photographer, and Vicente Muñoz, a boatman, discussed the evolution of La Albufera as a natural and cultural site in Valencia. The panel discussion and Q&A were moderated by REVOLVE's Patricia Carbonell, AMWAJ's Communications Manager.

Fighting Disinformation: Tools and Strategies for Fact-Checking

25 NOVEMBER 2024

On Mediterranean Day, AMWAJ hosted the event Fighting Disinformation: Tools and Strategies for Fact-Checking at its second Tabadul in 2024. The region faces climate challenges, often exacerbated by misinformation.

The online event, moderated by Patricia Carbonell, featured a panel of fact-checking experts debunking myths and sharing tools to combat climate-related disinformation, focusing on the Mediterranean. Participants learned about myths and effective fact-checking techniques using real-life examples and audience questions.



The AMWAJ Community comprises journalists, academics, professionals, and experts, primarily focusing on environmental topics, from across the Mediterranean region and beyond. Official AMWAJ updates and announcements are shared via the dedicated Announcement channel within the WhatsApp Community to enhance the visibility of AMWAJ's activities. Members are encouraged to actively contribute to the Community by sharing updates about their own events, calls for participation, opportunities, or potential collaborations. This collective approach fosters greater engagement, knowledge exchange, and collaboration across the network.






AMWAJ Internal Events




MedCities joined AMWAJ
